HISTORICAL

Early in the spring of 1931 plans were laid for an outing club at Rutgers University for the enjoyment of a group of faculty members and their friends among the professional people of New Brunswick and vicinity. It was hoped that such a club would furnish the facilities of cleared trails and a woods lodge which would serve as a headquarters for various trail and camp activities.

On April 23, 1931, a proposal for the establishment of the club was sent to about one hundred people suggesting that activities begin in the fall. There was enough interest shown to call a meeting on May 5th, when about thirty persons met for discussion of the plan. It was agreed that the club should be soundly organized with the usual officers, committees and form of government, and that there should be a program of activity maintained throughout the year. Sufficient money was collected to proceed with plans.

The organization committee, consisting of Earle B. Perkins, Marshall Smith, William H. Cole, Leon A. Hausman and Alice G. Higgins, secured permission from the President and Board of Trustees of Rutgers University to use the Canfield estate, near Dover, N. J., for the purposes of the club.

The Lodge was formally opened to members on October 11, 1931, when a steak barbecue was served to about sixty people. On October 19th a business meeting was held in New Brunswick, and the University Outing Club was permanently organized.

During the next year monthly meetings were held at the Lodge with a total attendance of over two hundred and fifty. Besides the regular scheduled events, there were many week-end outings of individual groups and guests. In May, 1932, the annual business meeting and banquet was well attended and enjoyed. The Lodge has been modestly furnished for week-end activities, and a large outdoor fireplace and several trails prepared.

TRAILS

The trails committee has plans for an active year. The present local trails will be repaired and improved, and some new ones laid. The prospecting and blazing of the Green Pond Mountain trail, which will eventually connect with the Appalachian trail in northwestern New Jersey, is the feature of this year's trail program. Any member interested in trail activities should communicate with the chairman of the committee.

THE LODGE

The lodge committee has the problem of improving the house and grounds, besides attending to the regular upkeep. Any suggestions by members for making the lodge and grounds what they should be will be gladly received by the committee.

MEMBERSHIP

The membership committee is charged with the responsibility of securing new members. Every member should feel free to nominate his friends. The committee will do the rest.

THE PROGRAM - 1932-33

In order to increase the usefulness of the lodge, for individual groups, there will be "open house" every Saturday and Sunday from October 8 to May 28, inclusive. A host, or hostess, or both, will be present to open, close, heat and light the lodge, and for the convenience of the members and their guests. Announcements of the hosts will be made monthly.

The trails and the lodge committees will post on the bulletin board a list of "things to do" for those who wish to do them.

March 19th—

Sunday Ramapo River Canoe Trip. Special notices will be sent out about March 10th. Also "open house" at the Lodge.

April 23rd—

May 20th—
